We are delighted you've chosen to support us in our journey to end homelessness, whilst supporting people on their own personal journeys towards their independence and a home to call their own.

2022 is our **50th** year and we are helping more people than ever - providing homes for hundreds of people affected by homelessness. Support from local businesses plays a huge part in helping our growth and we are delighted you've chosen to support us.

Corporate support is important to us - giving us the chance to work alongside you to change lives for the better and as already mentioned, the work we do adds years to the lives of those who we support and that means we can have a positive impact on more than just homelessness, **we impact lives.**

Ending homelessness creates a better quality of life for people affected by homelessness - taking the strain away from local authorities, providing a future that wouldn't be possible on the streets.

Research shows that the average age for people dying on the streets is 45 for men and 43 for women. The recent Office for National Statistics figures tell us that people who aren't homeless have a life expectancy of nearly double that - ending homelessness has a greater impact on lifespans than most people realise.

We've enjoyed incredible corporate relationships, ones that have had a long-lasting impact on our service users, like the one with the Southern Co-op which you can read about on page three.

We've loved working with Society of St James as it has been so much more than just a charity to fundraise for. It has been a true partnership with passionate people who make a real difference to individual's lives and the local community.

Working on various projects with SSJ created a buzz in the office as our colleagues wanted them to be successful. Echoing our own strong community values, we initially focused on SSJ's Café in the Park in Portsmouth, helping it to become more self-sustaining.

Then we worked with SSJ's team to launch Pay It Forward which enabled local people to help the homeless through a voucher scheme. Since then there have been so many more projects we have worked on together using expertise from our retail, funeral and coffee businesses.

The partnership was proof of **how much more can be achieved together**, working cooperatively, rather than in isolation. So we were really pleased to have this recognised with **two national awards in 2020** - The Business Charity Awards and the Third Sector Business Charity Awards.

We have also been proud to donate more than £50,000 to SSJ's projects. Overall, it was an incredible chance to have a major impact and really make a difference to those who need it.

We've all seen the news reports, the cost of living has risen to unprecedented levels. Not only is it more expensive to purchase energy - but the cost of food has risen exponentially.

The cost of living crisis has come at a time when even more people are at threat of being made homeless - due to the nature of increasing prices and wages that have stagnated in comparison.

We have been working hard to support people within our services, but the issues are long-standing and challenging. We support around 2500 people every year who are on low income and benefits, who rely on extra support to help them overcome a history of homelessness.

Winter is fast approaching, and we are working hard to create a system to help residents and services users during this time - including launching our annual Christmas Campaign in October, which will help make a massive difference to those in our services.

But we are increasingly aware of **the urgency to help support people affected by homelessness** to overcome the challenges faced by the cost of living crisis with additional provisions of food, support with heating and much more as the cold winter months kick in.

We are seeing the direct impact on people in our services, across our projects, including those in independent housing, and on the residents in our care homes.

Liam has faced many challenging situations in his life - but this is a story of empowerment and of overcoming the odds. Liam came from a small town in Suffolk - riddled with bad memories and a life of drugs, alcohol, and death. He turned his life around on the south coast, with the support of the Society of St James and a more positive setting - and is now a new dad - something that has changed his outlook on life.

I ask Liam about the **support he has had from The Society of St James**, and the impact this has had on his recovery. Without hesitating, Liam replies, "Immense" he says. He looks across to Kat and nods his head, "**they have just been brilliant, mate, you know when you get that breath of fresh air moment.**"

Liam continues, "I have always struggled with the drug agencies, but the Society is so different, they treated me like a person and an individual and I know they have played a massive part to get me where I am now." But the journey for Liam has also been one of self-improvement. His will and determination to split himself away from the negative influences - and his drive to move his life forward is one that also deserves praise.

Liam's determination for a **new life has also led him to a place where he is the happiest he has been in his life**. For the past three years, Liam has been in a secure and strong relationship with his wife, Kelly - who he met when visiting friends back in his home town. Upon getting to know each other and forming that bond, the two realised they were in love - and have had a son - something that **Liam described as "the most life changing experience I have ever known".**
